
"Jesus Brings Life!" Fr. Rowel Jose (Arjay) Abanto

Jesus always touched others by His words and deeds. He brought not only physical healing but the whole self was restored. In our gospel this Sunday, again Jesus is touched by or himself touches someone ritually and ceremonially unclean but not only is Jesus not contaminated, the ones who had been contaminated to begin with are made holy and whole. He has crossed the boundaries that had once defined the community, has rewritten the rules, and so has revealed a new day. The woman with hemorrhage has reinstated her to fullness of life as Jesus is the resurrection and the life. Not only is she physically cured, but she is fully returned to a normal social life and can be fully integrated into her society. She is a whole person in every sense, individually and socially. But it was her deep faith in Jesus, symbolised by her merely touching the hem of his garment, which was a major factor in her healing. In the second story of the gospel, it talks about Jesus taking the hand of the little girl and says to her: Talitha koum, which means, "Little girl, get up!" And the 12-year-old girl immediately got up and walked around quite normally, as if nothing had been wrong with her. Whether she was dead or in a coma, she was restored to fullness of life, and Jesus is revealed as the Lord of life. No wonder that who witnessed the scene "were overcome amazement". He is recognised as the Creator, the Conserver and the Final Goal of all that I am and can be, of all that we are and can be. This is also our prayer to Jesus as Lord of life that He may help us reach that level of health, wholeness and holiness like the two women. May we have the faith and trust like them as we approach Him everyday.


