

Come and join us, everyone is welcome.

In Eucharistic Adoration, we enter into a profound communion with Jesus. The consecrated host, the Body of Christ through the mystery of transubstantiation, rests on the altar as a focal point for prayer. In the quiet reverence, a deep stillness allows for a heartfelt conversation with the Divine. This encounter with the Real Presence of Christ fosters a closeness to God that enriches the soul.

As today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Corpus Christi (The Body and Blood of Christ), we are being reminded of God's infinite mercy and love for us. God the Father gave His Only Begotten Son, Jesus Christ, for us to 'take and eat', for our nourishment. When we receive Him in the Holy Eucharist, we become the one Body of Christ, and we become family to one another as Christ is our Brother with One Father in heaven.

The Last Supper is the most significant meal of Jesus and the most important occasion of his breaking of bread. In this meal Jesus identifies the bread as his body and the cup as his blood. When the Lord Jesus commands his disciples to eat his flesh and drink his blood, he invites us to take his life into the very center of our being (John 6:53). That life which he offers is the very life of God himself. Jesus' death on the cross, his gift of his body and blood in the Supper, and his promise to dine again with his disciples when the kingdom of God comes in all its fullness are inseparably linked.

Jesus instructed his disciples to "do this in remembrance of me". These words establish every Lord's Supper or Eucharist as a "remembrance" of Jesus' atoning death, his resurrection, and his promise to return again. "For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes" (1 Corinthians 11:26). Our celebration of the Lord's Supper anticipates the final day when the Lord Jesus will feast anew with his disciples in the heavenly marriage feast of the Lamb and his Bride. This meal was a memorial of his death and resurrection. When we receive from the Lord's table, we unite ourselves to Jesus Christ, who makes us sharers in his body and blood.

As we celebrate this Feast, let us come together and be with the Real Presence of Christ, by joining in the 40 Hours Adoration for Vocations on June 7-9. Let us praise, worship, and gaze Him with love and humility. The Lord is waiting and ask us to spend an hour with Him. Come let us adore Him!
